American Red Cross in the Finger Lakes

Assists service members and their families, disaster/fire victims; and provides instruction in swimming, first aid, CPR, health care, Project Share, blood services, and STAR/FLYER (teen peer HIV/AIDS education program).

Child and Family Resources, Inc.

Serves as a community coordinating and planning agency for local child care services and offer a variety of supports to child care providers, parents, businesses, and local governments. Creative Choices Child Care Center

Offers child care for children of parents who work, attend school or employment training. 6 weeks - 12 years.
